Waqf violence: 2 WB bros held for killing man-son

'Murshidabad Duo Dragged Outside, Killed'

Kolkata/Jangipur: Two brothers from Bengal's Murshidabad were arrested Tuesday on charges of hacking to death a father and son in Jafraabad, adjoining their native village, on April 12 after their dissent over the new Waqf law descended into mob violence.

"Kalu Nadab, alias Asabul, and Dilbar Nadab, alias residents of Digra village," additional director general of police (law and order) Jawad Shamim said.

Dilbar was arrested from a hideout close to Bangladesh, suggesting he might have planned to flee across the border. Kalu, named in the FIR along with five others, was picked up from Birbhum's Murarat.

The absconding suspects — Yusuf Sheikh, Akbar Sheikh, Hazrat Ali, Nurul Sheikh and Ansar Ali — are all residents of the area. Investigators are verifying if any of the arrested brothers had personal enmity with the victims — septuagenarian Hargobindo Das and his 40-year-old son Chandan, both artists who made a living creating clay idols of deities.

Amid spectre of violence, Bengal sees muted New Year celebration

Dhulian: Traders in Bengal have a tradition of opening new "haalkhatas" (ledgers) on Poila Baishakh, marking the advent of the Bengali New Year. In violence-ravaged Murshidabad, the spirit of celebration was replaced on Tuesday by the silence of a broken community.

Nemai Ghosh, a resident of Aurangabad in Suti, opened his outlet Jananyiya Sweets but had few customers. Shards of glass and remnants of a damaged shutter littered the storefront.

On Poila Baishakh, the store usually has a queue of customers waiting to buy rosogollas and shingaras (Bengali version of samosa). "We had received bulk orders and was worried whether I could deliver on time. My workers arrived last night and we opened the store, but sales were not this year compared to what we get on this day. My only satisfaction is reopening my business after four days," he said.

In nearby Dhulian, Dilip Sarkar opened his three-decade-old grocery store at 8am. "Poila Baishakh is important to traders," he said. "It is a tradition to start a new ledger on this day... My family is anxious, but I could not stay home." For many others, there was little to celebrate. "My house was all but destroyed in the mob rioting," said elderly Debji Sardar, who returned to her home in Bhabna the previous day. She was one among several hundred residents who had crossed the Ganga to take refuge in a Malda school.

Murshidabad administration has started a survey to identify damaged homes. Around 60 have been listed so far. Relief and rehabilitation are likely to start Wednesday.

Lathi only treatment for rioters, says Yogi

Attacking WB CM Mahata in Barmer, UP CM Yogi Adityanath said on Tuesday that "Bengali is burning" but its CM is "silent". Yogi compared Bengal's current law and order to pre-2017 UP. "We restored law and order in UP because we only understand one language — that of lathi. Mere words won't stop them," he said. TN

Control. Instead of restricting themselves to engineering minor incidents as 'asked by TMC leaders', they resorted to bloody clashes that claimed three lives, central govt sources told TOI, citing sources from intelligence agencies and other sources, reports Bharti Jain.

The suggestions or objections received after the specified date shall not be considered.
- The application shall be taken up for the further hearing by the Commission on 22.4.2025. Any person who files suggestions or objections may in his/her discretion attend the hearing, for which no TADA shall be paid by the Commission.
